### **RECOMMENDATION**:

#### That the Board:

- 1. Approve the proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), substantially in the form on file in the Board Office, between the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP), the Bureau of Engineering (BOE) of the Department of Public Works, and the Department of General Services (GSD), to include additional project funding sources in the amount of \$1,300,000 and a revised date of completion of June 30, 2006, for the construction of a new recreation center building at the East Wilmington Greenbelt Community Center (#1736D)(W.O. #E170365F), subject to approval of the City Attorney as to form;
- 2. In accordance with the proposed Amendment No. 2, upon its execution, direct Department staff to ensure that BOE secures the necessary Council approval to appropriate \$1,300,000 in construction funds to GSD, prior to the start of construction as follows:

- 3. Direct staff, in accordance with the Council instructions included in CD 05-0600-S534, to ensure prompt repayment of \$1,300,000 to the Reserve Fund, used to cash flow the project from the fund accounts listed above,
- 3. Direct the Board Secretary to transmit Amendment No. 2 to the City Attorney for review and approval as to form; and,
- 4. Authorize the General Manager to execute Amendment No. 2, upon approval as to form by the City Attorney.

#### **SUMMARY**:

The East Wilmington Greenbelt Community Center project (#1736D) (W. O. #E170365F) will provide for a new 9,000 square foot community center with a full size gymnasium, parking lot and related park landscape development at 918 North Sanford Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90744.

On February 18, 2004, the Board approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP), the Department of Public Works - Bureau of Engineering (BOE), and the Department of General Services (GSD), for the construction of the new community center for a construction cost of \$3,300,000 (Board Report No. 04-46). Due to unforeseen site conditions, economic changes and changes in scope, the MOU with the GSD needs to be amended for a revised project completion date of June 30, 2006 and increased construction budget in the amount of \$1,300,000 for a total project budget of \$4.6 million. The project is 95% complete. It was originally scheduled for completion in April, 2006.

As reported to the Steering Committee, the project encountered several unforeseen site conditions that included contaminated soil conditions and unique coordination and construction requirements due to an existing fuel lines easement. In addition, the GSD also indicated that the project costs have increased due to increases in material costs as well as several items were outside of the original scope of work and were not part of their original cost estimate. The GSD requested an additional \$1,300,000 to complete the project. Subsequently, the City Council as part of the Second Financial Status Report approved an additional \$1,300,000 for the project in November, 2005 (Council File No. 05-0600-S34). The additional funds to be used on this project are State Bond funds, and as such, do not impact the General Fund (see table below).

## **FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:**

Additional funds being requested are State Bond funds and are anticipated to be received in June 2006. This project does not impact the City's General Fund. Future operations and maintenance costs have yet to be determined.
