<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the Board:

- 1. Accept the work performed under Contract No. 3181 as outlined in the body of this report;
- 2. Authorize the Department's Chief Accounting Employee to release all retention monies held under Contract No. 3181 to Atlas Tracks, Inc., 35 calendar days after acceptance by the Board; and,
- 3. Authorize the Board Secretary to furnish Atlas Tracks, Inc., with a letter of completion.

SUMMARY:

On January 4, 2006, the Board authorized the Department to enter into a sole source construction contract with Atlas Tracks, Inc., in the amount not to exceed \$80,000, for the surface replacement of two existing basketball courts at the Green Meadows Recreation Center (Board Report No. 06-04) located at 431 East 89th Street in the Ninth Council District. The material used to replace the concrete courts is a synthetic material that comes from the sole of re-cycled Nike shoes. This material requires less long-term maintenance than traditional concrete surfaces. Funding for these projects came from Nike, Inc., under a Gift Agreement by and between Nike, Inc. and the City of Los Angeles, in the total amount of \$80,000.

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The basketball courts replacement was constructed under the management of the Architectural Division of the Bureau of Engineering (BOE) and was substantially completed on May 24, 2006 for the final contract amount of \$77,400. The Department's construction crew performed additional work on the site after the completion date, and on June 24, 2006, the Department and the Ninth Council District dedicated the new basketball courts.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

This project had no fiscal impact on the Department's General Fund as the costs of construction and installation was funded entirely through the Nike, Inc. Gift Agreement.
