# **SUMMARY:**

The proposed Rancho Cienega Sports Complex Track & Field Improvements project is located at 5001 Rodeo Road, Los Angeles, CA 90016. The improvements include replacing the Jackie Robinson Stadium running track, fitness area and pole vault track surfacing with new rubberized material. In addition, within the boundary of the running track, there is the football field whose natural turf is to be replaced with synthetic turf. A new subterranean drain system will be installed and connected to the existing storm drainage. The existing irrigation system will be modified to allow removal of the sprinkler system in the football field and continue irrigation of the other areas outside the running track.

Staff recommends awarding this project to GSD in lieu of conducting a competitive construction bid process for the following reasons:

- Reconstruction of the football field has to be completed by end of August 2009. Starting September, the field is heavily used during the football season by Dorsey High School, View Park High School, Frederick Douglas High School, Pop Warner Association, Baldwin Hills Youth Football Association, Wilshire Youth Football Association, and others.
- The scope of work is a "Specialty Work" that requires manufacturer-approved contractors for installation of rubberized track and synthetic turf. Synthetic turf and track manufacturers warrant their products when installed by manufacturer-approved installers. GSD has a list of qualified City-approved vendors who are specialized in installation of rubberized track and synthetic turf.
- GSD can perform the removal of existing natural turf while selection of vendor is in process.
- Approximately three to four months can be saved from bid and award time by having GSD and their selected City-approved vendor perform construction. GSD is authorized to perform this work per Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 22.535(a)(5).

In addition to timeliness, GSD has experience in successfully completing various Department of Recreation and Parks projects. BOE will provide construction management services for GSD in the construction of the track & field, football field, fitness area and pole vault track project.

Approved project funds are available for the construction work from Proposition 40 RZH which will initially be covered by cash flow from the PWTF and, in turn, PWTF will be reimbursed upon receipt of funds from the State in the following fund and accounts.

In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), staff has determined that the proposed improvements will consist of alterations to existing facilities and construction of an accessory structure, and will not have any significant impact on the environment. Therefore, the project has been determined to be Categorically Exempt pursuant to Article III, Section 1 (a) Class 1 (1) and Section 1 (k) Class 11 (6) of the City CEQA Guidelines. A Notice of Exemption will be filed with the City of Los Angeles and County Clerks.

# FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

There are adequate funds for the proposed construction project. Therefore, there is no anticipated fiscal impact on the Department's General Fund. The assessment of the future operations and maintenance costs has yet to be determined.
