SUMMARY:

On January 9, 2008, the Board of Recreation and Parks (Board) awarded Contract No. 3237 in the amount of \$5,943,597 to Western Alta Construction, Inc., for the construction of the Lafayette Park – Recreation Center (PRJ1435A) (W.O. #E170317F) project. The project site is located at 625 Lafayette Park Place, Los Angeles, CA 90057.

Plans for the project were prepared by the consultant Kanner Architects. The design called for the demolition of approximately 4,500 square feet of an existing building and the construction of a new addition of approximately 12,200 square feet; thus creating an approximately 17,000 square foot recreation center.

The addition included a gymnasium, clubroom, and accessory spaces. The existing basement was converted into new offices, clubroom, mechanical/electrical rooms, and storage. A new parking lot, hardscape and landscaping were also added. The construction systems included concrete masonry walls; structural steel braced frames, metal deck roofing and steel trusses, storefront window wall system, methane mitigation system, and a concrete pier and grade beam foundation.

During construction, the following change orders were added to the project: Additive Alternate No 1, "Replacement of existing windows and doors, including frames, in the existing Community Center", and Additive Alternate No. 5, "Removal of acoustic ceiling in existing Community Center". The project was completed with a total of \$1,061,091.61 in issued Change Orders or 17.85 % of the original contract amount. The total contract amount to date is \$7,004,688.61.

The construction of the original scope of work, plus the additive alternates and change order work is now complete. Staff is recommending the partial acceptance of work and the partial release of the retention monies. To date, the City has withheld retention monies in an amount equal to 10% of the total base bid amount plus 10% of the building change orders executed or \$700,468.86. Staff is recommending the release of \$525,351.74 or approximately 75% of the retention fees.

Article 48 of the General Conditions of the contract states that the City may, if the work is progressing satisfactorily, release part of the retention of the work for which a statement of partial completion has been issued, provided that the following conditions have been met:

- 1. Partial final inspection corrections have been completed to the satisfaction of the Inspector;
- 2. The contractor submits a written request for release of retention which includes a verifiable valuation of the identified portions of the work covered by the statement of partial completion;
- 3. Impacted subcontractors, major suppliers and the contractor's surety all agree in writing to release retention;
- 4. If any minor corrections remain which do not directly affect operations or maintenance then twice the values of the remaining cleanup items shall be retained on each request for release; and,
- 5. The contractor signs a change order which specifically states the value of the retention being released.

RAP staff has consulted with the Office of Contract Compliance (OCC) concerning the status of the labor compliance requirements and Affirmative Action requirements on the project and, to date, there are no outstanding wage violations, and Western Alta Construction, Inc., is in compliance. As of April 11, 2011, there are six (6) stop notices with a total amount of \$94,655.31. Of which, only \$13,722.21 were withheld from payments.

At the request of the Planning, Construction and Maintenance Division of RAP, BOE has requested the Contractor to submit a proposal for work related to improvements to the toilets in the old community building area. Additionally, a safe closet enclosure is requested to store computer equipment and a shut-off relay to be installed for the emergency lighting system in the gymnasium. Authority is requested to allow the BOE Project Manager to negotiate and execute a change order(s) in an amount not-to-exceed \$75,000 to complete this work.

Upon approval of this report, \$75,000 in Quimby Fees can be transferred from the Quimby Fees Account No. 460K-00 to the Lafayette Park Account No. 460K-LD for the Recreation Center project at Lafayette Park. The total Quimby Fees allocation for the Recreation Center project, including previously approved Quimby fund allocations, is \$1,240,704. These Fees were collected within two miles of Lafayette Park, which is the standard distance for the allocation of the Subdivision/Quimby Fees for community recreational facilities.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

There is no fiscal impact to the RAP's General Fund. The costs for operations of the facility are included in the RAP's Fiscal Year 2011-2012 operating budget for facilities.

SUMMARY:

The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners, at its meeting held on May 4, 1994, accepted work performed by G & G Solar, Inc. dba G & G, Inc. (G & G) for work performed on the Sylmar Recreation Center - Park Development (#1140A) project, Contract No. 2529.

At the time of acceptance, the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Contract Administration, Office of Contract Compliance had determined that the prime contractor, G & G, failed to comply with the labor compliance requirements of the contract. Based on the evaluation of the inspector's logs, certified payroll records, worker interviews, and other pertinent payroll documents, it was determined that G & G failed to pay the correct prevailing wage rate and under-reported the number of workers employed on the project. As a result of the evaluation, it was determined that G & G underpaid wages by \$1,017.62 and incurred penalties in the amount of \$775.00 for a total \$1,792.62. Consequently, this amount was withheld from the retention payment to G & G to cover all labor compliance issues on this project. These funds are to be paid to the State of California.

The total amount of wage restitution and State penalties to be forfeited is \$1,792.62 as detailed below:

SUMMARY:

On April 7, 2010, the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board) approved Board Report No. 10-075. This action approved the construction of certain improvements at San Pedro

Plaza Park which is located at 700 South Beacon Street in San Pedro (Exhibit A). Design components include a system of safe, attractive, pedestrian paths, and stairways. This system will include signs, arrows, and other design elements that direct visitors up to the park to take advantage of the opportunities that it provides to view the Port. Improvements in the park itself will include new walkways and railings; a Harbor overview seating area; a Port and bridge overlook area with interpretive signage and improved view corridors. It will also include upgrades to landscaping, irrigation, and lighting. If it is determined that the existing stairs require repair and/or replacement it will also be part of this project. A conceptual design of the proposed project is attached as Exhibit B1 and B2. The Board's action also approved a Memorandum of Understanding with the Harbor Department that described the Harbor Department's responsibility to provide necessary funding of up to \$5,000,000 to complete the project and RAP's responsibility to complete the design and construction of the improvements and, upon its completion, maintain the improvements.

Subsequent to the Board's action of April 7, 2010, the Harbor Department proposed to change the disbursement schedule of the available funding. This change was partly due to the availability of funds and the Harbor Department's desire for accountability for the completion of work. The original disbursement schedule had the Harbor Department releasing funds in the following amounts:

- 1. \$500,000 upon completion and approval of final plans.
- 2. \$1,000,000 upon submittal of a detailed project budget and schedule and proof of completion of construction documents, bid packages, and award of construction contract.
- 3. \$1,500,000 after submittal of progress update and 30% project completion.
- 4. \$1,500,000 after submittal of progress update and 60% project completion.
- 5. \$500,000 upon final project completion and park maintenance for one (1) year after completion.

The revised disbursement schedule recommended by the Harbor Department has the following fund release schedule:

- 1. \$890,000 upon agreement of Project Scope of Work and Project Schedule which include "soft costs" such as survey, geotechnical work, CEQA, project management, construction management and administration, design, permits, inspection and consultation.
- 2. \$2,055,000 (50% of construction costs) during Bid and Award phase.
- 3. \$2,055,000 (50% of construction costs) upon 25% of construction completion.

This revised disbursement schedule is considered a significant change to the original MOU and therefore Board action on this matter is required. Additionally, Board approval of the disbursement schedule is required under Article IA of the MOU.
