- 1. Approve the final acceptance of work performed under Contract No. 3349 for the Benny Potter West Adams Avenue Memorial Park (Benny Potter Park) (W.O. #E170486F) project as outlined in the Summary of this Report;
- 2. Authorize the Department's Chief Accounting Employee to release all retention monies held under Contract No. 3349 for the Benny Potter West Adams Avenue Memorial Park (Benny Potter Park) (W.O. #E170486F) project to Pima Corporation, thirty-five (35) calendar days after acceptance by the Board; and,
- 3. Authorize the Board Secretary to furnish Pima Corporation with a letter of completion.

SUMMARY:

The construction contract Benny Potter West Adams Avenue Memorial Park (Benny Potter Park) (W.O. #E170486F) project was awarded to Pima Corporation on May 20, 2011 (Board Report No. 11-126), in the amount of \$297,900. The contractor started construction on August 22, 2011 and completed the project on May 17, 2012. The project site is located at 2327 West 24th Street, Los Angeles, California 90018.

The scope of work included:

- 1. Demolition, site preparation and grading.
- 2. Installation of new permeable paving walkways.
- 3. Installation of new concrete paving and headers.
- 4. Installation of new decomposed granite paving.
- 5. Installation of new picnic tables, barbccues and a drinking fountain.
- 6. Installation of a new pre-fabricated metal picnic shelter.
- 7. Installation of solar-powered security lighting.
- 8. Installation of a new irrigation system.
- 9. Installation of new trees, shrubs and lawn.
- 10. Installation of fitness equipment.

The Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering (BOE), Construction Management Division (CMD), completed the construction management of the project under the Proposition K - L.A. for Kids Program. The Department of Public Works, Bureau of Contract Administration issued a Statement of Final Completion on August 16, 2012. The facility opened to the public on July 2, 2012.

BOE has informed the Department of Recreation and Parks (Department) that this project was completed with seven (7) Change Orders issued, for a total of \$61,334 or 20.6% of the base contract amount. The total contract amount in completing the construction is \$359,234. During construction, the following change orders were added to the project:

- 1. Replace sidewalk, curb and trees.
- 2. Remove and replace drinking fountain.
- 3. Remove 35 cubic yards of soil and revise solar lights.
- 4. Securing Building and Safety permit.
- 5. Installation of sod.
- 6. Cover pole foundation.
- 7. Final bond adjustment.

BOE has consulted with the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Contract Administration, Office of Contract Compliance concerning the status of the labor compliance requirements and Affirmative Action requirements on the project. There are no outstanding wage violations and Pima Corporation is in compliance.

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FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The Department received funding during Fiscal Year 2012-2013 for the maintenance of these improvements. At this time, there is no additional budget request needed.

That the Board:

- 1. Approve the submission of a Kaiser Permanente Operation Splash Program 2013 grant application to Kaiser Permanente to augment funding for the Department's aquatics programming in the amount of approximately \$265,000, subject to Mayor and City Council approval;
- 2. Direct staff to transmit a copy of the grant application to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), and to the City Clerk for committee and City Council approval before accepting and receiving the grant award, pursuant to Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 14.6 et seq. as may be amended;
- 3. Authorize the Department's General Manager to accept and receive the Operation Splash Program 2013 grant award, if awarded, in the amount of approximately \$265,000 from Kaiser Permanente for aquatics programming; and a supplemental program for Kaiser Permanente's "Rethink Your Drink" campaign, subject to the approval of the Mayor and City Council;
- 4. Designate the Department's General Manager, Executive Officer, or Assistant General Manager, as the agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents,

including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the project(s); and,

5. Authorize the Department's Chief Accounting Employee to appropriate funding received to the necessary account within "Recreation and Parks Grant" Fund 205 to accept the Operation Splash Program 2013 grant, if awarded, in the amount of approximately \$265,000 for aquatics programming.

SUMMARY:

In anticipation of the 2012 release of the Kaiser Permanente (Kaiser) request for grant proposals for the Operation Splash Program 2013 (Program), the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks (Department) requests approval to submit a grant application to help fund aquatic programs that provide safe physical activities in low-income neighborhoods. The Program's objectives include: 1) increasing opportunities for safe physical activities in low-income neighborhoods where health disparities are greatest and opportunities for safe physical activity are often scarce; 2) teaching children and adults basic water safety and swimming skills in order to prevent drowning; 3) promoting life-long physical activity; and 4) promoting healthy beverage choices.

The grant will provide supplemental funding for the Learn to Swim Program, Junior Lifeguard Program, and an extended pool season at approximately 47 pools, and Kaiser's "Rethink Your Drink" campaign, which encourages healthy beverage choices, at Department pools located within disadvantaged areas. The aquatic programs teach youth swimming fundamentals, water safety, emergency response, teamwork, and goal setting. Approximately 7,000 youth ages 7 to 17 years old are projected to be served through this grant program.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The acceptance of this grant does not require a match. The grant provides needed funding for additional aquatic services to youth. There is no fiscal impact to the Department's General Fund.
