RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Board:

- 1. Authorize the City Engineer to negotiate change order(s), in an amount not-to-exceed \$170,000, for additional scope to the project, including additional trees, retaining walls, and infield mix for T-Ball diamond; and,
- 2. Authorize the City Engineer to approve subsequent change order(s), in an amount not to exceed \$170,000 for additional scope to the project, including additional trees, retaining walls, and infield mix for T-Ball diamond.

SUMMARY:

On June 6, 2012, the Board awarded Contract No. 3386 (Board Report No. 12-173) in the amount of \$348,000, to Ranbay Construction Corporation, for the Palms Recreation Center – Soccer Field (W.O. #E170326F) project, located at 2950 Overland Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90064.

The scope of work includes the installation of new natural turf soccer field, new seating wall and retaining wall, a new irrigation system, new trees and lawn, new drinking fountain, new six-foot high fence and refurbishment of the existing T-ball infield.

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During the early phase of the construction, a large mature stone pine with six (6) leaders was identified as dying by the City's Arborist and was therefore required to be removed and replanted with six (6) additional replacement trees. The City's Arborist also instructed the project team to revise the design of the proposed retaining wall, so that it is located further away from two (2) existing trees to protect the existing trees, and to allow additional space for growth.

Furthermore, a design error was discovered for the new T-ball Diamond. While the demolition plans required the scraping and the clearing of the existing T-ball field up to two-inch depth, the construction documents failed to call out the specifications for the infield mix. At the request of Department staff, a change order needs to be issued to address this design requirement for the new T-ball diamond.

The project is now 10% complete in construction and cost savings and unused project contingencies have been identified within the original project budget. These funds are specified Proposition K funds that can only be used for this project and cannot be transferred to another project, and Quimby funds which had been previously allocated to this project.

Preliminary change order estimates place the value of each change order over 10% of the construction contract, with the cumulative change order value expected to exceed 25% of the construction contract amount. The change orders will surpass the authority limit of the General Manager and therefore require Board approval (Board Report No. 06-136).

To date, zero (0) change orders have been issued for the project.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Board:

- Authorize the Department of Recreation and Parks (Department) General Manager to accept and receive the Visa Rejuvenation Grant in an amount up to \$100,000 from National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) for an outdoor improvement project at Julian C. Dixon Park, subject to approval of the Mayor and City Council;
- 2. Designate the Department's General Manager, Executive Officer, or Assistant General Manager, as the agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the project;
- 3. Authorize the Department's Chief Accounting Employee to establish the necessary account within "Recreation and Parks Grant" Fund 205 to accept the Visa Rejuvenation Grant from NRPA in an amount up to \$100,000; and
- 4. Direct staff to transmit a copy of the grant award to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), and to the City Clerk for committee and City Council approval, pursuant to the Administrative Code Section 14.6(b) as may be amended.

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SUMMARY:

In August 2012, the National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) invited the Department of Recreation and Parks (Department) to receive a Visa Rejuvenation Grant. In partnership with NRPA, the Visa Rejuvenation Grant is an initiative to renew, refurbish and rejuvenate neighborhood parks in Dallas, Los Angeles, and New York City.

Selected to participate in this initiative, the Department was asked to submit up to five different capital improvement projects at a park site located within an underserved area. Based on the criteria of the grant, the Department's Planning, Construction and Maintenance Division staff selected Julian C. Dixon Park as the project site, which has been approved by Visa, and identified the following proposed capital improvement projects for the park:

- 1. Playground Replacement/Refurbishment
- 2. Basketball Court and Court Lighting
- 3. Walking Path and Landscaping
- 4. Picnic Area and Benches
- 5. Park Lighting

The final capital improvement project selection will be determined through a public voting process managed by the Visa organization.

Each of the proposed capital improvement projects are estimated to cost at least \$100,000 or more.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

It is anticipated that the Department may need to use supplemental funding depending on the improvement project voted on by the community. There will not be a fiscal impact to maintain this facility, as staff will continue to provide the necessary maintenance services.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board accept a donation from the Los Angeles Clippers, Inc. (LAC), consisting of monetary and in-kind support with an estimated value of \$12,000, for the support of free golf clinics for youth at the Tregnan Golf Academy in Griffith Park, as noted in the Summary of this Report, and that appropriate recognition be given to the donor.

SUMMARY:

On August 6-9, 2012, the Golf Division, with monetary and in-kind support provided by LAC, hosted free golf clinics for youth at the Tregnan Golf Academy in Griffith Park.

Over the four days, two hundred and forty (240) youth participated in the golf clinics receiving instruction on putting, driving, chipping, and proper etiquette on the golf course. Participants also received lunch and a polo shirt. The total value of the program provided was twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000).

For the past 22 years, the Los Angeles Clippers has joined with the Department to work with inner city children ages 5 to 16 to promote the fundamentals of basketball, sportsmanship and athletics as an alternative to negative influences. From 1990 to 2012, this collaboration has resulted in programs such as Neighborhood Pride, Pride Jam, Citywide Basketball Finals, NBA 2ball, Summer Basketball Clinic Series, Summer Swim Clinics and Golf Clinics.

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The Department acknowledges the kind and generous support provided by the Los Angeles Clippers for the youth golf clinics at Tregnan Golf Academy.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

Acceptance of this donation results in no fiscal impact to the Department's General Fund as LAC has subsidized up to \$12,000 in youth golf clinic related expenses.
