Find Asphalt Fabric, second low bidder, to be non-responsive to the bid requirements for failure to meet the Business Inclusion Program (BIP) requirements, failure to complete Schedule A (Subcontractors and Suppliers), failure to meet the Prime Contractor's self-performance requirement, failure to complete City Ethics Commission (CEC) Form 50 (Bidder Certification), and failure to submit the Iran Contracting Act Compliance Affidavit, all as defined in the bid documents;
- Find Horizons Construction Company International, Inc. (Horizons Construction), third low bidder, to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the Whitsett Fields Park Synthetic Turf Improvements (PRJ20757) (W.O. #E170150F) project;
- 5. Award the construction contract to Horizons Construction in the amount of ^{*}Two Million Five Hundred Thirty Five Thousand Dollars and Fifty One Cents (\$2,535.382.51), all according to the plans and specifications;

- 8. Authorize the General Manager or his designee to make technical corrections as necessary to carry out the intent of this Board Report; and,
- 9. Authorize the Board President and Secretary to execute the construction contract, subject to approval by the City Attorney as to form.

SUMMARY:

On August 12, 2015, the Board approved the final plans and specifications for the Whitsett Fields Park Synthetic Turf Improvements (PRJ20757) (W.O. #E170150F) project located at 6900 Whitsett Avenue, North Hollywood, California 91605 (Board Report No. 15-182). The plans and specifications were prepared by the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering (BOE), Architectural Division.

The project plans and specifications call for the renovation of one (1) existing large soccer field and two (2) small soccer fields into synthetic turf fields, installing conduits for future sports field lighting, and expanding the existing parking lot at the Whitsett Fields Park. New bleachers, shade structures for the bleachers, fencing, landscaping, irrigation, and American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant walkways servicing the renovated soccer fields are also part of the project scope of work.

The City Engineer's estimated construction cost for the project is \$2,120,000.00.

On September 29, 2015, the Board received a total of nine (9) bids as follows:

The determination of the low bidder was defined in the bid documents as the bidder submitting the lowest base bid on the Schedule of Work and Prices form. The bidders were also required to submit pricing for installation of each of the two small synthetic soccer fields (Deductive Alternate #1 and Deductive Alternate #2). The bidder's base bid includes both of the deductive alternates. Additionally, bidders were required to submit with their bid Schedule A (Subcontractors and Suppliers), which is a form that

lists the bidder's proposed dollar value to be self-performed and lists their subcontractors and the respective subcontracting amounts. Bidders must also submit other documentation related to the City's contracting policies and the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) requirements. Furthermore, bidders had to complete and upload certain completed City contracting requirements forms onto Los Angeles Business Assistance Virtual Network (LABAVN).

COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED

Four (4) letters were received by the Board after the receipts of bids. Three (3) were bid protests and one (1) was a clarification received from the apparent low bidder (Attachment No. 2).

The Instruction to Bidders requires that the bidders complete and submit Schedule A (Subcontractors and Suppliers) with their bid. The bidder must list all of its subcontractors and suppliers on Schedule A. The bid documents require that the prime contractor perform, with its own organization, contract work amounting to at least 30 percent of the base bid price. The information on Schedule A is used to help determine whether the bidder has met the 30 percent prime contractor's self- performance requirement.

Although the low bidder, CS Legacy submitted the lowest base bid, the Schedule A submitted by CS Legacy was incomplete in that it did not indicate the dollar value of the work CS Legacy would self-perform, nor did it indicate the dollar value of work to be performed by the synthetic turf subcontractor. Since CS Legacy failed to indicate the dollar value of the work they would self-perform and also failed to indicate the dollar value of work to be performed by its synthetic turf subcontractor, it is not possible to determine the value of work to be performed by CS Legacy and whether they met the 30 percent self-performance requirement.

On November 2, 2015, CS Legacy submitted a letter to the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners explaining that the person submitting their bid was rushing to submit the bid and unknowingly left out some of the information on Schedule A. CS Legacy characterized the omission as a clerical error. CS Legacy explains that on September 30, 2015, one day after the deadline for receipt of bids, they uploaded onto LABAVN a completed Schedule A along with their uploading of documents relating to their Business Inclusion Program (BIB) Good Faith Efforts. Note that Schedule A is

usually not part of the BIP documentation that is uploaded onto LABAVN. Failure to submit a completed Schedule A <u>with the bid</u>, and failure of a bidder to establish <u>in</u> <u>their bid</u> that the bidder met the 30 percent self-performance requirement are both material bid requirements that cannot be waived, and submittal of the completed Schedule A cannot be accepted after the September 29, 2015, deadline for receipt of bids (*Valley Crest Landscape, Inc. v. City Council of the City of Davis* (1996) 41 Cal.App.4th 1432). Therefore, CS Legacy is deemed to be non-responsive.

The second low bidder, Asphalt Fabric, failed to meet the City's Business Inclusion Program (BIP) requirements in that they did not submit any of the documentation required to establish that they passed Indicator No. 6 (Negotiate in Good Faith) of the BIP Good Faith Outreach Effort. Also, the Schedule A submitted by Asphalt Fabric was incomplete in that it they did not indicate the dollar value of the work they are to selfperform, nor did they indicate the dollar value of work to be performed by any of their subcontractors. Since Asphalt Fabric failed to indicate the dollar value of the work they would self-perform and also failed to indicate the dollar value of work to be performed by each of their subcontractors, it is not possible to determine the value of work to be performed by Asphalt Fabric and whether they met the 30 percent self-performance requirement. Additionally, Asphalt Fabric failed to submit a completed City Ethics Commission (CEC) Form 50 (Bidder Certification), which must be submitted with the bid pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 48.09(H). Asphalt Fabric also failed to submit the Iran Contracting Act Compliance Affidavit, which must be submitted with the bid pursuant to California Public Contract Code Sections 2200-2208. For all of the above reasons, Asphalt Fabric is deemed to be non-responsive.

At the bid opening, Horizons Construction, the third low bidder, submitted a Schedule A that indicated that they will self-perform \$1,370,000, which is 54.4% of the base bid amount. After reviewing their total subcontracting amount and deducting it from their listed base bid, the resulting dollar value of the work to be self-performed is \$1,316,745 or 52.2%. Regardless of which method is used to calculate the amount of work Horizons Construction will perform on its own, this bidder meets the 30 percent Prime Contractor self-performance requirement, as specified in the bid documents.

Horizons Construction is found to be the lowest responsible bidder. Their bid, in the amount of \$2,518,000.00, is 18.8 percent higher than the City Engineer's estimate. However, based on the range of bids received for this project, BOE believes that this bid is reasonable.

Since this project has CDBG funding, it is subject to federal regulations and requirements, including compliance with the Davis-Bacon Wage Act. Staff has reviewed all certifications and documentation submitted by Horizons Construction and determined that Horizons Construction's bid complies with the CDBG bid requirements.

The bid documents included detailed specifications and requirements for the synthetic turf contractor. Staff has reviewed the listed subcontractor, Astro Turf, and found them to be acceptable.

BID PROTEST BY WAISMAN CONSTRUCTION

Waisman Construction filed a bid protest dated October 1, 2015 (Attachment No. 3), stating that CS Legacy, Asphalt Fabric, and Horizons Construction each submitted non-responsive bids as follows:

A. CS Legacy had blanks and is missing information on Schedule A, the completed form was unreadable, and the listed turf subcontractor is not on the approved list of turf installers.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and found that the Schedule A submitted by CS Legacy (Attachment No. 6) is incomplete. The Schedule A lacks sufficient information to determine if this prime contractor met the 30 percent self-performance requirement. CS Legacy is deemed to be non-responsive. Staff did not review the listed turf subcontractor after the non-responsive determination was made.

Given that staff has determined that CS Legacy is non-responsive, staff recommends that the Board note and file Waisman Construction's bid protest against CS Legacy.

B. Asphalt Fabric failed to include Form 23A (Iran Contracting Act), had missing information required on Schedule A, and the listed electrical subcontractor did not have a current California Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) registration as required by State Law.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and determined that Asphalt Fabric failed to meet the minimum requirements for the City's Business Inclusion Program (BIP), as discussed earlier in this report. Staff also found that the Schedule A submitted by Asphalt Fabric (Attachment No. 7) is incomplete and lacks sufficient information to determine if this prime contractor met the 30 percent self-performance requirement. Asphalt Fabric also failed to submit a completed CEC Form 50 and did not submit the Iran Contracting Act Compliance Affidavit, as discussed earlier in this report. Asphalt Fabric is deemed to be non-responsive. Staff did not review the listed electrical subcontractor after the non-responsive determination was made.

Given that staff has determined that Asphalt Fabric is non-responsive, staff recommends that the Board note and file Waisman Construction's bid protest against Asphalt Fabric.

C. Horizons Construction's base bid amount is incorrect, Schedule A is illegible, no electrical subcontractor was listed, and the math between the value of self-performance work and the total of subcontractor work in incorrect.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and determined that some of the claims are not accurate. The base bid amount that is listed on the Schedule of Work and Prices (page 4 of the bid documents) is the bid amount that is binding on the bidder. Horizons Construction listed \$2,518,000.00 as its base bid on the Schedule of Work and Prices, and that is the bid amount that is binding on Horizons Construction.

The bidder is required to list on Schedule A (Attachment No. 8) the dollar value of the work to be self-performed, and is also required to list its subcontractors and the value of the work to be performed by each subcontractor. Whether the bidder met the 30 percent self-performance requirement can be determined using either of two methods, and Horizons Construction met and even exceeded the 30% self-performance requirement using either of the two methods as follows:

- 1) The listed amount to be self-performed taken as a percentage of the base bid (\$1,370,000 is 54.4% of \$2,518,000); or
- The base bid amount minus the sum of all listed subcontractors, which leaves the value of work to be self-performed by the prime contractor [\$2,518,000 (base bid) minus \$1,201,255 (sum of all subcontractor work) = \$1,316,745 (work to be self-performed by the prime contractor), which is 52.2% of the base bid].

Waisman Construction's protest points out that deducting the sum of the value work to be performed by all of the subcontractors from the base bid does not equal the amount listed to be self-performed. Staff recognizes that there is a mathematical discrepancy between the amount listed to be self-performed (\$1,370,000) and the amount left for the prime contractor to perform (\$1,316,745) after deducting the sum of all the subcontractor work from the base bid. However, as discussed above, using either method, Horizons Construction met and far exceeded the 30 percent self-performance requirement. Horizons Construction is obligated to perform the contract for its base bid amount of \$2,518,000, and is obligated to subcontract the work as listed on Schedule A, in compliance with Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 10.14. Thus, the mathematical discrepancy in Schedule A is immaterial.

The electrical scope of the project is to install empty conduits and pull boxes. This scope of work may be performed by the general contractor. Thus, Horizons Construction did not have to list an electrical subcontractor on Schedule A.

Horizons Construction is determined to be responsive. Therefore, staff recommends that the Board reject Waisman Construction's bid protest against Horizons Construction.

BID PROTEST BY HORIZONS CONSTRUCTION

Horizons Construction submitted a bid protest dated October 6, 2015 (Attachment No. 4) stating that CS Legacy and Asphalt Fabric submitted non-responsive bids as follows:

A. CS Legacy did not provide the dollar value of work to be performed by the prime contractor on Schedule A and this dollar value must be at least 30% of their base bid.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and found that CS Legacy did not provide sufficient information on Schedule A (Attachment No. 6) to determine whether they met the 30 percent self-performance requirement. CS Legacy is deemed to be non-responsive.

Given that staff has determined that CS Legacy is non-responsive, staff recommends that the Board note and file Horizons Construction's bid protest against CS Legacy.

B. Asphalt Fabric did not provide the dollar value of work to be performed by the prime contractor on Schedule A and this dollar value must be at least 30% of their base bid. Horizons Construction states that Asphalt Fabric failed to list the dollar value of each subcontractor.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and found that Asphalt Fabric did not provide sufficient information on Schedule A (Attachment No.7) to determine whether they have met the 30 percent self-performance requirement. Asphalt Fabric is deemed to be non-responsive.

Given that staff has determined that Asphalt Fabric is non-responsive, staff recommends that the Board note and file Horizons Construction's bid protest against Asphalt Fabric.

BID PROTEST BY ASPHALT FABRIC

Asphalt Fabric submitted a bid protest dated October 8, 2015 (Attachment No. 5) stating that CS Legacy is non-responsive and that Asphalt Fabric is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

Asphalt Fabric states that CS Legacy does not meet the qualifications for cement stabilization for synthetic turf and did not provide the dollar value and contractor's license for Hella Construction, the listed turf subcontractor.

Response: Staff reviewed the bid documents and determined that cement stabilization for synthetic turf can be completed by the turf subcontractor. Although this qualification is met, CS Legacy was deemed to be non-responsive for other reasons, as discussed above. Staff did not review the issue of not listing the dollar value and contractor's license for Hella Construction after the non-responsive determination was made.

Given that staff has determined that Asphalt Fabric is non-responsive, staff recommends that the Board note and file Asphalt Fabric's bid protest against CS Legacy.

It should be noted that Asphalt Fabric, did not provide all of the information required on Schedule A (Attachment No. 7) and did not upload the required BIP documentation. Hence, Asphalt Fabric itself is deemed to be non-responsive.

BUSINESS INCLUSION PROGRAM

The project is also subject to the City's new Business Inclusion Program (BIP), in compliance with the Mayor's Directive No. 14, which replaces the former Minority Business Enterprise, Women Business Enterprise, and Other Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE/OBE) Good Faith Effort Subcontractor Outreach Program. Horizons Construction has successfully posted all the required BIP outreach documentation on the Los Angeles Business Virtual Assistance Network (LABAVN) that demonstrated satisfactory effort in its outreach to Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), Women Business Enterprise (WBE), Small Business Enterprise (SBE), Emerging Business Enterprise (EBE), Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE), and Other Business Enterprise (OBE) for sub-bid or subcontracting businesses. Staff has evaluated the outreach documentation submitted by Horizons Construction and determined that they have passed all six indicators as required for the effort to obtain sub-bid/subcontracting participation by MBE, WBE, SBE, EBE, DVBE and OBE businesses, and is in compliance with the BIP outreach requirements. The outreach documentation package is on file in the Board Office, and a synopsis of the said package is attached to this Report (Attachment No. 1).

Staff reviewed the responsiveness and work performance of Horizons Construction on past City projects and found them to be satisfactory. The Department of Public Works, Office of Contract Compliance (OCC) indicated that there have been no labor compliance violations and that the bidder has complied with all other legal requirements.

The City Attorney and staff have reviewed the bid submitted by Horizons Construction and found it to be in order. Staff recommends that the Board find Horizons Construction to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

TREES AND SHADE:

The project scope includes planting seventeen (17) new trees and installing a new shade structure over the new bleachers.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

This project was previously evaluated for environmental impacts in accordance with California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and was determined to be categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant to Article III, Section 1c(6) and Section 1k(3) of the City CEQA Guidelines. A Notice of Exemption (NOE) was filed with the Los Angeles City Clerk and the Los Angeles County Clerk on June 20, 2013. It was also determined that this project and the environmental conditions of the site have not substantially changed since the previous evaluation. Therefore, no additional CEQA documentation is required.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

At this time, there is no immediate fiscal impact to the Department for the actions recommended in this Board Report. The construction project is fully funded as shown above. Maintenance costs for synthetic fields are anticipated to be less than maintenance costs for natural turf fields. Upon completion of the project, the adjusted maintenance costs will be submitted in the Department's annual budget request.

- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers the the listed synthetic turf subcontractors name is unreadable and a license number is not provided and neither a dollar value of this scope. We could not find any construction company named Aellos construction on the approved installers list as called out on Part 1 article 1 and 1a page 6 of 17 of the "synthetic turf and sub base drainage" specs.

ASPHALT, FABRIC & ENGINEERING INC.

- bidder failed to include an executed form 23A with its bid to the owner.
- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers the "dollar value of base bid to be performed by prime contractors" has been left blank.

- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers description of self performed work was left blank
- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers the base bid amount at bottom of the page has been left blank.
- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers the the listed Electrical subcontractor "Walt Const Corp #310770" does not have a current DIR registration as called out by law.

HORIZONS CONSTRUCTION CO INT'L INC

- on page 16 of the bid proposal "schedule "A" subcontractors and suppliers the base bid amount at bottom of the page is illegible and the base bid number is incorrect
- the math for self perform work of \$1,370,000 is incorrect when adding up all listed subcontractors dollar values and deducing from Horizons bid amount.
- No listed Electrical subcontractors. Horizons do not hold a C-10 license and therefore cannot do this work themselves.
- When adding up the values of the listed subcontractors of \$1,191,257.00 and the value of the work to be performed by the prime of \$1,370,000.00 the total is \$2,561,257.00 which is \$43,000.00+- higher then Horizons bid amount and that is without the inclusion of the electrical scope that based on the other 3 apparent low bidders is roughly \$70,000.00

We herby request that the listed Thee apparent low bidders bids are rejected based on the above listed items.

I am writing on behalf of Horizons Construction Company International, Inc ("Horizon"). In connection with its bid to City of Los Angeles Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners Whitsett Fields Park-Synthetic Turf Improvements W.O. No. E170150F ("the Project"). Please consider this letter to serve as a formal protest of the award of the contract to any bidder other than Horizons.

It is my understanding that the preliminary bid results show that C.S. Legacy Construction Inc. is the apparent low bidder and that Asphalt, Fabric & Engineering, Inc. is the second low bidder. Under the California Public Records Act, bidders have the right to examine the bidding documents of the successful bidder. Gibbs & Hunt, California Construction Law § 2.02(G)(1). Horizons is now exercising that right because Horizons suspects that there are irregularities in the bids of C.S. Legacy Construction Inc. and Asphalt, Fabric & Engineering, Inc. the two low bidders.

Based on Horizons limited and preliminary review of Schedule "A" of the bid documents, Horizons believes that C.S. Legacy Construction Inc. and Asphalt, Fabric & Engineering, Inc. bids to be non-responsive due to the following apparent reasons. Horizons reserves the right to supplement this protest with more facts;

C.S. Legacy Construction, Inc. lowest bidder failed to list the Dollar Value of Base Bid to Be Performed by Prime Bidder on Schedule "A". Prime Bidder must perform with its own forces at least 30 percent of Base Bid Price, not listing the Dollar Value of Base Bid to Be Performed by Prime Bidder conflicts with the requirement. C.S. Legacy failed to list the License number and the base bid price for the listed Turf subcontractor. Asphalt, Fabric & Engineering, Inc., 2nd bidder also failed to provide the Dollar Value of Base Bid to Be Performed by Prime Bidder on Schedule "A". Prime Bidder must perform with its own forces at least 30 percent of Base Bid Price, not listing the Dollar Value of Base Bid to Be Performed by Prime Bidder conflicts with the requirement. They also failed to list the description of work being performed by the Prime Bidder. On the list of subcontractors they failed to list the dollar value of each Subcontractor.

This letter is a formal protest against any award of the contract to a bidder other than Horizons. Horizons reserves the right to supplement this protest with additional facts. Horizons also requests notice pursuant to Government Code section 54954.1 of all meetings related to the award. If this letter is insufficient to accomplish any of these purposes, please let us know immediately what else is required so we can comply.

The City of Los Angeles, along with public contracting code has mandated several important requirements in the project specifications relating to qualification criteria and especially experience requirements:

Project Qualification Specifications

- Per Section B: Stabilized Soil Base Course Section B. Required Contractors Experience: The Contractor shall demonstrate experience on at least TWO(2) sub-grade stabilization projects of the type herein specified.
 - It is our belief that C.S. Legacy does not meet these qualifications for cement stabilization for a synthetic turf sub-strait section.
- Per Specifications Part 1 General Installation Qualifications, B. Submittals, Page 6 of 17 of General Conditions and Supplement Specifications
 - Prime contractor shall perform a minimum of 50% of all work. No proposal for work will be accepted from a contractor who is not licensed in accordance with applicable state law.
 - It is noted that if a C S Legacy failed to specify subcontract (Hellas Const.) for any portion of the work to be performed under the contract, he shall be deemed to have agreed to perform such portion himself, and he shall not be permitted to subcontract that portion of work except by the written consent of the awarding authority. Additionally.. C S Legacy failed to include Hellas Constructions Contractors License Number and Dollar Value of the Subcontract on Schedule 'A" of the Bid package. The requirement of the submission of this list, the legal consequences for failure of the Contractor to do so, and other particular details concerning the same shall be as set forth in the "Subletting and Subcontracting Fair Practices Act," California Public Contract Code (sections 4100 et seq.) to which the bidder is hereby referred. (See Attached)
