REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

BOARD OF RECREATION AND PARK COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES

Wednesday, November 7, 2018

The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners of the City of Los Angeles convened the Regular Meeting at the Ramona Hall Community Center at 9:34 a.m. Present were President Sylvia Patsaouras, Vice-President Lynn Alvarez, Commissioner Pilar Diaz, and Commissioner Joseph Halper. Also present were Michael A. Shull, General Manager, Anthony-Paul Diaz, Executive Officer and Chief of Staff, Deputy City Attorney IV Mike Dundas, and Deputy City Attorney III Steven Hong.

CALL TO ORDER

Sylvia Robledo, District Representative for Councilmember Gil Cedillo, made opening remarks and welcomed the Board Commissioners and audience to the First Council District.

Anita Meachem, Superintendent, Metro Region, introduced the Ramona Hall Community Center staff and provided background information about the facility.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Diaz moved to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of October 3 and October 17, 2018; this motion was seconded by Commissioner Alvarez. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Alvarez and President Patsaouras shared similar concerns as to whether the proposed naming of this project has adhered to the established Board procedures and requested that the naming of this park be referred to the Commission Task Force on Facility Repair and Maintenance to ensure the Department's naming guidelines are followed, in particular regarding the appropriate public outreach, before the naming of the park property is presented to the Board for approval.

Michael A. Shull, General Manager, provided the following highlights and updates to the Board.

- Thursday, November 8, 2018 (11:00am) Annual 90+ Legacy Luncheon will be hosted at Friendship Auditorium located at 3210 Riverside Drive Los Angeles, CA 90027. The 90+ event has been in existence for more than 24 years and honors our senior citizens throughout the City. This year's theme is "Life is a Carnival." In past years, there have been as many as 15 honorees that have exceeded the age of 100. This year, we estimate honoring 20 centenarians. - November 8, 2018 (2:30pm) Rancho Cienega Sports Complex Groundbreaking Ceremony to celebrate the development of an upgraded and expanded sports complex.
