The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners of the City of Los Angeles convened the telephonic Regular Meeting at 9:34 a.m. Present were President Sylvia Patsaouras, Commissioners Tafarai Bayne and Nicole Chase. CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

President Patsaouras called for a motion to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of May 6, 2021. Commissioner Bayne made such motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Chase. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 3-0.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Michael A. Shull, General Manager, announced that RAP continues to work with City Council and the Mayor's Office in the budget process for next fiscal year. Mr. Shull shared that the outlook looks very positive for RAP's budget. He also announced that Summer Camp registration is open at 103 locations, as would normally be offered, at a cost of \$10 per week at over 75% of these sites. Mr. Shull then stated that over 2,000 are registered for the first week and over 16,000 registrations for the summer season. He then divulged that construction and aquatics staffs continue to prepare for the Summer pool season, as RAP got a late start due to various COVID related reasons. Mr. Shull also stressed that RAP will be offering a pared down Summer Night Lights (SNL) program and will continue to work with the Mayor's Office of Gang Reduction and Youth Development (GRYD) as this yearly program evolves during the summer season.
