APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

President Patsaouras called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 3, 2022 with a revision. Commissioner Chase made such motion, and it was seconded by Commissioner Bayne. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Anthony Paul Diaz, Executive Officer and Chief of Staff, Mr. Diaz stated that park programs are opening up, with staff working closely with the Department of Public Health to ensure we are following sensory inclusive certified, and the site staff and exhibits are ready for a comfortable experience for guests with sensory sensitivities.
