SUMMARY

Angels Gate Park is located at 3601 Gaffey Street in the San Pedro area of the City. This 70.44-acre facility is operated by the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP). The facility provides outdoor basketball courts, a children's play area, the Historic Korean Friendship Bell, hiking trails, and walking access to other parks. Approximately Six Thousand and Twenty Six (6,026) City residents live within a one-half (1/2) mile walking distance of Angels Gate Park. Due to its facilities and features, and the programs and services provided on site, Angels Gate Park meets the standard for a Regional Park, as defined in the City's Public Recreation Plan.

PROJECT SCOPE

On March 17, 2022, the Board of Recreation and Parks Commissioners (Board) approved the following scope of work for the Project (Report No. 22-056):

- Replacement of existing playground located near the Korean Bell with new playground with safety surfacing.
- New path of travel from existing parking lot and pathways.

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- Installation of site improvements including paving, seating, and hydration station.
- Improvements to landscaping and irrigation system.
- Installation of an ADA complaint sidewalk leading from the nearby parking lot to the playground.

Following the approval of Report No. 22-056 (Attachment 2), RAP staff was made aware of the community's concerns regarding the playground design that was shown in the previous board report. In response to the community's concern, RAP staff developed a new playground design that is shown in Attachment 1 of this Report. RAP staff recommends that the Project's original scope of work be modified so that the playground design as shown in Attachment 1 replaces the playground design originally proposed in Report No. 22-056.

On August 11, 2022, the conceptual renderings of the revised playground design was presented to the Angels Gate Complex Park Advisory Board (PAB). As the PAB did not have a quorum, the PAB did not take an action on the revised playground design but the members voiced their preference for the new playground.

RAP staff has also been in communication with the Korean Friendship Bell Preservation Committee since August 2022. The Korean Friendship Bell Preservation Committee asked for changes to the original playground's design features, including the roof panels, the colors chosen, and for additional musical instruments. The requested changes have all been incorporated into the overall look of the newly designed playground as shown in Attachment 1.

RAP staff has determined that additional funding will be required in order to cover the cost of the revised playground design.

PROJECT FUNDING

Previously, the Board approved the commitment of a maximum of Five-Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) in Park Fees to the proposed Project (Report No. 22-056).

Upon approval of this Report, Two Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand, Two Hundred Four Dollars and Nineteen Cents (\$284,204.19) in Park Fees can be committed to the proposed Project.

The total amount of funding available for the Project is Eight Hundred Thirty Four Thousand, Two Hundred Four Dollars and Nineteen Cents (\$834,204.19), which is the total budget inclusive of the contingency amount set forth below.

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The Park Fees were collected within ten (10) miles of the portion of Angels Gate Park in which the Project is situated, which is the standard distance for the commitment of Park Fees for regional recreational facilities pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.33 E.3

PROJECT CONSTRUCTION

RAP Staff has determined that sufficient funding has been identified for the Project and construction is anticipated to begin in Winter of early 2023.

TREES AND SHADE

The proposed Project has no impact on the existing trees at Angels Gate Park. The new play area includes integrated shade toppers.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The proposed Project consists of a change of design of a project previously approved and the allocation of additional funds.

The change of the project design does not consist of substantial changes that would require additional environmental evaluation, therefore, the propose Project is limited to the allocation of funds for a Project which has previously been evaluated for environmental significance and processed according to the requirements of these City CEQA Guidelines.

Based on this information, staff recommends that the Board of Recreation and Parks Commissioners determines that the proposed Project is statutorily exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 2, Section 2(i) of City of Los Angele CEQA Guidelines and Section 21082 of California Public Resources Code.

FISCAL IMPACT

The approval of this commitment of Park Fees will have no fiscal impact on RAP's General Fund. The estimated costs for the design, development, and construction of the proposed park improvements are anticipated to be funded by Park Fees or funding sources other than RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the proposed park improvements can be performed by current

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staff with minimal impact to existing maintenance service at this facility.








Angel's Gate Playground Option 5 Color Opt 2 LA City, CA

A rendering and layout of the proposed playground equipment is shown in Attachment 1.

PROJECT FUNDING

Upon approval of this Report, Five-Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) in Park Fees can be committed to the proposed Project.

The anticipated pre-qualified on-call contracts for this Project will be for Playground Equipment Installation. The budget contingency for the Playground Equipment Installation contracts will be Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00).

These Park Fees were collected within ten (10) miles of Angels Gate Park, which is the standard distance for the allocation of the Park Fees for regional recreational facilities pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.33 E.3.

PROJECT CONSTRUCTION

RAP Staff has determined that sufficient funding has been identified and construction of the proposed Project is anticipated to begin in Fall 2022.

TREES AND SHADE

The proposed Project will have no impact on existing trees and shade at the park.

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ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The proposed Project consists of replacement of existing structures where the new structure will be located on the same site and have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the structure replaced; new landscaping; minor trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored and construction and placement of minor structures accessory to (appurtenant to) existing institutional facilities.

The proposed Project site is in the coastal zone, within an historic site, on a hillside area. Staff will seek a Coastal Development permit and construction will follow Coastal Commission's recommendations. The nature of the project does not affect the hillside, nor the historical significance of the historic site. Also, playground design will be and construction will conform to existing regulations regarding hillside construction. No other known projects would involve cumulatively significant impacts, and no future projects would result from the proposed project. As of February 23, 2021, the State Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) (Envirostor at www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov) has not listed the Project site or any contaminated sites near the Project area (within 500 feet). According to the Caltrans Scenic Highway Map there is no scenic highway located within the vicinity of the project or within the project site. The proposed Project is located within MacArthur Upper Reservation, listed on California Register of Historic Resources (ID#5000) and in proximity of the Korean Bell, a City of Los Angeles Historic Cultural Monument (HCM#187). The replacement of the existing playground and the addition of an ADA compliant path of travel will not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

Based on this information, staff recommends that the Board of Recreation and Parks Commissioners' (Board) determine that the Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 2; Class 4(3); Class 4(12) and Class 11(6) of City CEQA Guidelines and Article 19, Sections 15302; 15304(b); 15304(f) and 15311 of California CEQA Guidelines. RAP Staff will file a NOE with the State Clearinghouse and the Los Angeles County Clerk upon the Board's approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The approval of the allocation of Park Fees will have no fiscal impact on RAP's General Fund.

The estimated costs for the design, development, and construction of the proposed park improvements are anticipated to be funded by Park Fees or funding sources other than the RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the proposed park improvements can be performed by current staff with minimal impact to existing maintenance service at this facility.
