<u>SUMMARY</u>

RAP's Youth Program Bus Services is essential to the success of seasonal Day Camps, especially during the 8 – 10 week Summer Day Camp season. Every year, RAP provides approximately 1500 bus trips, serving approximately 90,000 youth. The cost for bus services has increased significantly in recent years. The Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget approved one-time funding of \$500,000.00 through Proposition A Local Transit Assistance Fund. RAP needs to appropriate these funds to meet operational needs of its Youth Program Bus Services.

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FISCAL IMPACT

The appropriation of funds will have no negative impact on RAP's General Fund.
